Dining Facilities

The Hillcrest Market Place dining facility is open most days from dinner, Wednesday, June 8, to breakfast, Sunday, July 24. Serving days and times are subject to change and will be posted in the dining foyers.

Periodically throughout the summer when fewer camps are in residence, the Hillcrest Market Place will be closed and participants will eat at the Burge Market Place. Groups will be notified when it will be necessary to eat at Burge. No food may be taken from the dining rooms.

Guests are welcome for any meal and may purchase a guest meal at the dining area entrance. Hillcrest Market Place does not accept cash. Forms of payment accepted are Visa, Mastercard, Discover, UI Charge, and Hawkeye Dollars. Non-paying guests will not be permitted in the dining rooms. Guest meals are \$7.00 for breakfast, \$10.00 for lunch, and \$10.00 for dinner.

Welcome to the University of Iowa and to Hillcrest, Petersen, and Slater Residence Halls.

The university is pleased to make its adult housing facilities available to non-adult secondary students who are enrolled in summer camp programs and are mature enough to live independently on campus with limited staff supervision. Because the University Housing & Dining system is not designed to provide custodial supervision for persons under the age of 18, parents are advised to enroll their youth camper in a summer program only if they believe their camper is mature enough to live responsibly in an environment where building access is not restricted to residents only and where residents are free to come and go as they please within the residence halls during certain hours of the day and evening.

Black's Gold Grill

Our newest dining location, Black's Gold Grill located on the lowest level of Petersen Hall, will be open for conference attendees, campers and the public on a limited basis this summer, primarily Sunday – Thursday during the evenings. Hours will be based on conference and camp schedules and will be posted at Black's entrance. (Sorry, meal plan swipe cards will not be accepted.) On the menu you will find many sports grill favorites! Black's Gold Grill accepts cash Hawkeye Dollars, UI Charge, Visa, Mastercard and Discover.

Automated Teller Machine (ATM)

There is a 24-hour automated teller machine (ATM) in the Hillcrest lobby. Desks do not cash checks or make change.

Building Desks

The Hillcrest desk is open 24 hours a day while camps and conferences are in session. Hours before June 5 and after July 24 will be 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. Report any problems to the desk in person or by phone.

The Petersen desk will be open on a 24-hour basis from May 20 to July 30.

The Slater desk will be open on a 24-hour basis while summer camps/conferences are housed in the building tentatively from June 12 to July 24.

Computers

Youth conferences and/or camps will NOT have internet connectivity in their individual rooms for summer, nor will they have access to wireless internet on campus. Adult guests will have internet connectivity in their rooms (one wired port per bed). All users must abide by the UI ResNet Acceptable Use policy (<http://housing.uiowa.edu/resnet-policy>). Violation of this policy will result in the termination of an individual's summer connection. (Note: HawkID/Guest IDs are not needed to access individual internet ports in rooms.) The Hillcrest ITC (computer classroom) is available on a reservation basis only, by conference sponsors.

Visitors to the University of Iowa campus can enjoy free guest wireless service, courtesy of a partnership between Information Technology Services (ITS) and AT&T. Guests can take advantage of this convenience by selecting the "attwifi" network when configuring a device for wireless access.

Construction

Rienow Hall will be completely off-line for multiple construction projects. Sprinkler system upgrades will be installed in the North wing of Hillcrest Hall, taking this area off-line. As a joint project of the city of Iowa City and the university, ongoing work will continue (outdoors) on the Steam Utility Enterprise System. Demolition of Quad will begin in preparation for construction of the new Pharmacy Building. All of these construction projects may cause inconvenience (dust, noise, traffic congestion, etc.) and could possibly cause disturbances in some rooms, hallways, and lobbies. If you have any questions regarding these projects, please call University Housing & Dining at 319-335-3000.

Custodial Service

The custodial care of your room such as trash removal or towel service will depend upon the arrangements made by your conference. If towels are provided in your room, please be aware that they are provided for both you and your roommate. Sheets and towels are distributed to your room based on provisions selected by your conference sponsor. Requests for additional sheets and towels will not be fulfilled.

Damage Policy

Camps/Conferences will be responsible for the cost of repairs for any room damages or theft that occur during the time of occupancy, as well as for any public space damage that is caused by you or your group. Sports Camps reserves the right to bill damage charges to campers if the responsible people are identified.

Entrances

Hillcrest and Slater main entrances are unlocked at 6:00 a.m. and locked at 10:00 p.m. The Petersen main entrance will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Main entrance prox cards are issued to guests living in Petersen for af-

ter-hours building access. All other entrances will remain locked at all times. Do not prop open outside entrance doors. When locked doors are propped open, hall security is compromised and non-residents are allowed to enter.

Furniture

All university furniture provided in individual rooms at check-in must remain in each room. University Housing & Dining prohibits altering lofts during the summer; lofts must remain assembled in the manner in which they were pre-set in the rooms. Please leave mattresses on the beds. Furniture will not be removed from rooms based on occupancy. Lounge furniture is not allowed in resident rooms.

Illness or Injury

If any conference participant under the age of 18 becomes ill or is injured while staying in University of Iowa residence halls, their parents or guardians will be contacted immediately by the conference sponsor or by professional live-in Housing & Dining staff.

Keys

You will be issued a key to your room when you check in. You should keep your door locked at all times and you should not loan your key/prox card to others. If you lose a key/prox card, report it to your building desk as soon as possible. For each lost key or prox card, \$25 will be charged to the master conference bill. Report any thefts to Public Safety immediately at 319-335-5022. Please return your key/prox card to your building desk when you check out.

Laundry Rooms

There are laundry rooms available for summer guests to use in every residence hall. Washers and dryers are operated by University of Iowa Hawkeye Select cards. Machines are not coin operated. Residents may purchase Hawkeye Select cards from a vending machine located in the Hillcrest lobby. Laundry funds may also be added to “board plan cards.” Washers are \$1.50 per wash and \$1.00 per load for dryers. Hawkeye Select cards cost \$1.00 each for the initial purchase. Guests should bring their own High Efficiency laundry detergent and fabric softener. Instructions on how to use the laundry facilities are posted in laundry rooms.

Liability

The university does not carry insurance on the personal property of any resident. Each guest should determine if his or her personal property is covered by a homeowner’s policy; if not, it is recommended that personal property insurance be purchased. We also recommend that participants leave valuables at home.

Maintenance

Regular maintenance work and repairs are scheduled during the summer months. Maintenance and custodial personnel may need to enter your room to

repair, replace, or service furnishings. If you have questions about these activities, please contact the Hillcrest information desk.

Maintenance or custodial problems and maintenance emergencies for Hillcrest, Petersen, and Slater should be reported to building desks as soon as possible. General maintenance and custodial problems will be attended to Monday through Friday during working hours (8:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m.). Emergencies will be responded to on a 24-hour basis. After office hours and on weekends, report all maintenance or custodial problems to the counselors on your floor or the Hillcrest 24-hour desk at 319-335-9170.

Messages and Mail

Sports Camps' messages will be taken to the Hillcrest and Slater desks and delivered to residents by sports counselors. Sports Camps' mail will be given to counselors for distribution. UI Speaks staff will pick up and distribute their mail. Petersen guests can pick up their mail at the building desk. A USPS Mail collection box is located in the lobby of Hillcrest.

Parking

During check-in for sports camps, parking is available at an hourly rate, in the lot north of Hillcrest hall, as well as in the lots near the Field House. Parking is also available at parking meters. Meters are monitored from 7:30 a.m. through 11:00 p.m. daily. Campers may purchase temporary permits to park in the Hawkeye Storage lot, west of the Hall of Fame building. For more information, call UI Parking and Transportation at 319-335-8312. If parking procedures are not followed, vehicles may be ticketed or towed.

Personal Property

We strongly urge campers not to bring expensive electronics including TVs, video cameras, video games, cameras, tablets, or laptop computers. Label everything you bring, including clothes. We also recommend that each participant has personal property insurance.

Smoke Detectors

Intentional activation of any fire detection device will result in disciplinary action. Any problem with a smoke detector should be reported to the building information desk. Do not touch/remove smoke detectors at any time. Do not hang items from sprinkler heads and/or fire equipment.

Buses

Cambus, 319-335-8633, operates free intra-campus service while classes are in session. Bus schedules are available at building desks or at: www.uiowa.edu/~cambus/. Iowa City Transit, 319-356-5151, operates regular bus service Monday through Saturday.

Vending

The Hillcrest vending area is located down the hall from the desk area. Slater vending is in the basement, and limited drink machines are located in elevator lobbies. Petersen vending areas are on the main floor near the learning commons and in the elevator lobby. For money lost in vending machines or vending service, guests should call the phone number listed on the machine. Building desks do not issue refunds.

Policies

Living in a residence hall is a community living experience where all members have certain rights and responsibilities. Any resident/counselor/staff who intentionally commits, incites or aids others in committing any of the following acts of misconduct shall be subject to disciplinary action (including being sent home/asked to leave the halls) by University Housing & Dining and/or the University of Iowa. This applies to any summer resident regarding his/her own actions as well as the actions of guests.

1. Unauthorized occupancy or unauthorized entry into any residence hall facility or student room.
2. Interference with the right of access to residence hall facilities or with any contractual right of any person in the residence halls.
3. Individual or group activity within any area of the residence halls that causes a disturbance including hallway sports, inappropriate behavior, or behavior that threatens the rights and safety of other persons and/or university property.
4. Harassment, verbal or physical abuse, or the threat of physical abuse, including self-destructive behavior, in the residence halls or at any University Housing & Dining authorized function or event, or other conduct that threatens or endangers the health or safety of any person.
5. Failure to respond to a summons (verbal and/or written) from a residence hall staff member (including requests to meet to discuss alleged policy violations) or other university official and/or failure to follow directions from a UI

- staff member acting in the performance of his or her duties.
6. Obstruction or disruption of disciplinary procedures, University Housing & Dining administrative procedures, or any University Housing & Dining authorized functions or events.
 7. Tampering with or the misuse of smoke detectors/fire alarms (including sounding a false fire alarm), sprinkler heads, fire extinguishers, fire hoses, or any fire equipment; or limiting egress from the buildings by tampering with exit signs and doors.
 8. Unlawful manufacture, distribution, sale, use, or possession of illegal, addictive, dangerous, or controlled substances (including alcohol) on residence hall property. Empty alcohol containers and drug paraphernalia are prohibited.
 9. Theft, vandalism, misuse or misappropriation of university property or private property, or possession of stolen goods, including the misuse of any type of surveillance cameras.
 10. Any type of guns, paintball guns, bows and arrows, tasers and other weapons are prohibited in residence halls. Any device that has the appearance and/or function of a serviceable weapon or is being used in the manner of a real weapon is also prohibited in residence halls.
 11. The possession, use or distribution of any type of fireworks, ammunition/gun powder, fuses, or any explosives/combustibles of any kind is prohibited and will result in disciplinary action. Propane tanks may not be stored in the residence halls.
 12. Misrepresentation of identity or misuse of any identification card in the residence halls or failure to show appropriate identification upon request by a residence hall or university staff member.
 13. Misuse of room or building keys/proximity cards.
 14. Failure to follow emergency procedures (fire, tornado, etc.).
 15. Loud and disruptive behavior, inside or outside of a residence hall room.
 16. Setting of a fire or the possession or use of candles or any type of open-flame (including incense) or open filament device.
 17. Conviction of any federal, state, or local crime committed on campus.
 18. Violating the ResNet Acceptable Use Policy (when applicable) found on the University of Iowa web site under "ResNet" or found at: <http://housing.uiowa.edu/resnet-policy/>
 19. Violation of a published university campus policy. Published university policies include, for example, the Policy on Violence, the university Policy on Human Rights, and the Sexual Misconduct Policy Involving Students, including Sexual Assault and Sexual Harassment, found at: <http://www.uiowa.edu/~our/opmanual/>.
 20. Engaging in self-destructive behavior.

In addition, the following rules apply to all persons staying in University of Iowa residence halls. Violation of these rules will lead to disciplinary action.

Alcohol

The University of Iowa residence halls are substance-free environments. All summer residents, staff, and guests, regardless of age, are not permitted to consume or possess alcoholic beverages in residence halls. Any alcohol found will be destroyed, and disciplinary sanctions will be imposed. Persons found in a room where alcohol is present and/or is being consumed are subject to disciplinary action whether or not they were drinking. The presence of full or empty alcoholic beverage containers is prohibited. This includes containers used as decoration.

Bed Checks

All youth campers and live-in staff/counselors must follow the bed-check/curfew policies established by their particular camp.

Commercial Activities

Commercial activity in the residence halls is prohibited. Food delivery companies may deliver food and non-alcoholic beverage items provided the buyer initiates the order. If you encounter persons conducting door-to-door sales or solicitation, immediately contact a counselor or the building front desk.

Halogen Lamps

Halogen lamps are considered a fire hazard and therefore are prohibited in the residence halls.

Hoverboards

Due to recent fire concerns surrounding hoverboards, University Housing & Dining prohibits the possession or use of hoverboards in all residence halls, apartments and dining areas.

Pets

Summer conference/camp residents and guests are not allowed to bring pets into the residence halls at any time, including those “visiting” or on a “temporary” basis. Accommodations can be made for service animals with advance notice and proper documentation.

Room Switches/Changes

The conference sponsor, counselor, and the building front desk staff must approve any room change before it is made. If room changes are allowed, they are oftentimes completed during specified times.

Self-Destructive Behavior

Residents/counselors/staff who engage in self-destructive behavior must accept responsibility for their actions and are subject to disciplinary action, including being sent home/asked to leave the halls. When a severe act of self-destructive behavior or an apparent threat of serious harm occurs, the university reserves the right to notify the camper’s parent or guardian.

Smoking/Tobacco Use

Smoking is prohibited on the University of Iowa campus, both indoors and outdoors. The use of tobacco (including smokeless tobacco products and legal smoking products) is prohibited in campus buildings, including all residence halls. Counselors/live-in staff members over 18 years of age may possess and are allowed to store tobacco and legal smoking products but may not use them in the halls. Visitation

Summer residents are responsible for the behavior of their guests. Guests are not permitted to stay overnight. Individual camps may have additional guest/visitation policies.

Windows and Screens

Due to the potential danger to lives and property and out of consideration for the rights and privacy of others, the following regulations must be observed by all residents regardless of age. Screens are not to be unhooked or removed from windows for any reason. A fee will be assessed for re-hanging screens, as well as additional fees if the screen is damaged. Windows are not to be used for entrances or exits, except in the case of life threatening emergencies. Residents of a room or building are responsible for any objects ejected from windows, fire escapes, or roofs, and are subject to disciplinary action. Please keep windows closed and locked during inclement weather.

Emergency Procedures

If any emergency arises, help may be summoned by dialing 911.

Tornado/Severe Weather

In the event that a tornado is sighted in or around the Iowa City area, the Severe Weather System whistle will sound a steady three to five minute signal indicating a tornado warning. In addition, a campus outdoor alarm will sound for three minutes. In all residence halls, an indoor message will be aired through the alarm system alerting residents of the warning. The message will play for ten minutes and will only replay if there is a change to the warning. All residents should immediately relocate to a safe area, designated as interior corridors on lower levels or basements of all buildings. An "all clear" message will be aired when the tornado warning has expired. Please do not think when the alarms have timed out that the warning has expired. Residents should seek shelter until the all clear has sounded.

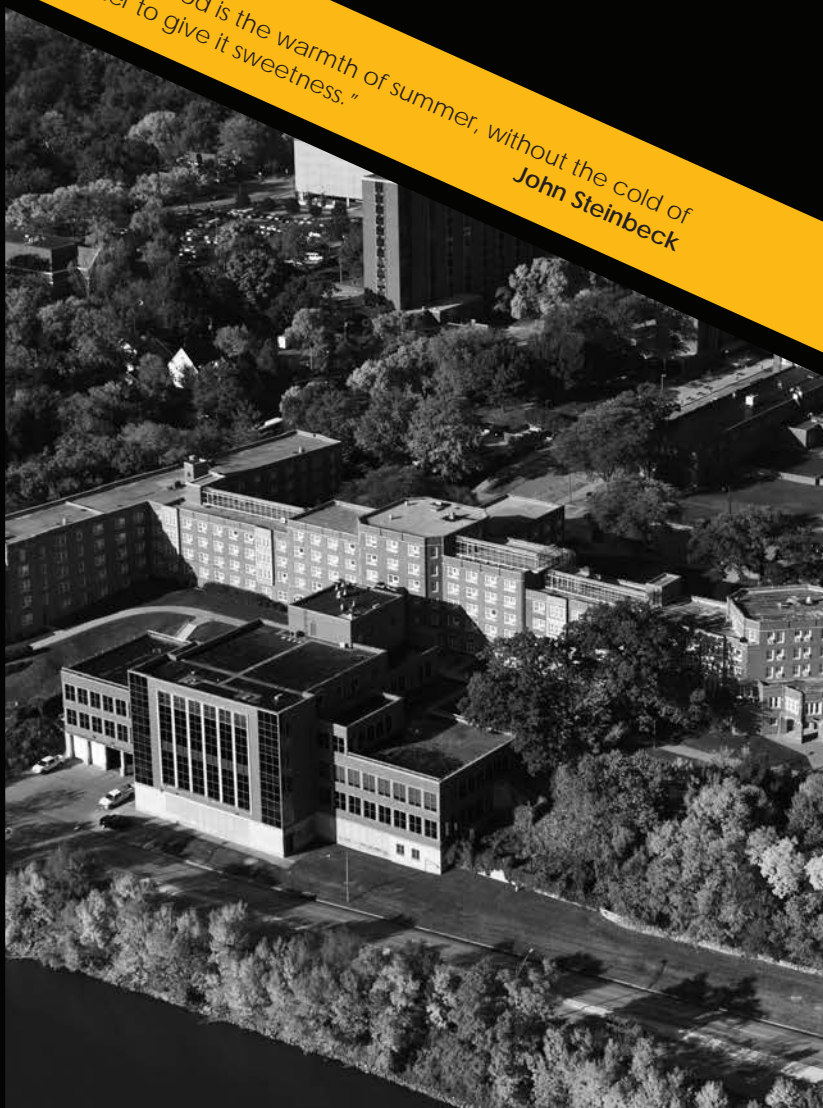
Fire

In the event of a fire in a residence hall, use the nearest pull station and evacuate the building immediately. If you hear the alarm sound, evacuate the building immediately. Do not use the elevators.
